<u>Lesson 7 – Tuesday: If You, Lord, Should Mark Iniquities</u>

- 1. If God kept score, treated us fairly, kept track of my sins.
 - a. God does keep track of sin.
 - b. **Malachi 3:2** "And who can stand when He appears? For He is like a refiner's fire and like launderers' soap."
 - c. **Revelation 6:17** For the great day of His wrath has come, and who is able to stand?"
 - d. **Isaiah 6:5** "Woe is me, for I am undone! Because I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts."
- 2. WE FORGET
 - a. Genesis 2:17 the day you eat of it ... / Romans 6:23 the wages of sin ... AND I ... HAVE SINNED
 - b. The slightest deviation from God's perfect plan means death
- 3. The Good News starts with the bad news
 - a. Psalm 130 should be our prayer
 - b. Psalm 25:7, 16-18 sorrow for sin
 - c. HAVE YOU EVER SORROWED FOR SIN yours? / mine? / ours?
 - NOT because of what sin has done to YOU, but what it has done to GOD?
 - If you should mark iniquities if you should make ME bear the weight of my sin
 - Turn That Around Lord, YOU *DID* mark my iniquities SO that YOU would not miss one when you bore the weight of each one.
- 4. **Vs. 3** But there is forgiveness with You, That You may be feared.
 - a. As a loving parent, God says to us, "this is going to hurt ME MORE than it hurts you."
 - b. He must find ALL of my sin NOT to punish me, BUT so that He can place on Himself.
 - **Isaiah 53:6** All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned, every one, to his own way; and the LORD has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.
 - **2 Samuel 12:13** Then David confessed to Nathan, "I have sinned against the Lord." Nathan replied, "Yes, but the Lord has forgiven you, and you won't die for this sin."
 - Picture David breaking down in sobs "I won't die! If You, O Lord, marked my iniquity, I couldn't stand. I was already sinking into the depths."
 - c. Like a surgeon taking scans to find every part of the cancer that must be removed "We will find it ALL"
 - **Psalm 139:23-24** "Search me, O God, and know my heart; try me, and know my anxieties; ²⁴ And see if there is any wicked way in me" (FIND IT ALL)
- 5. THEN WE CAN SING THIS SONG Psalm 32:1-5 -
- 6. **Vs. 5-6** Hope is placed parallel to Wait
 - a. What is hope? We say "hope" when we mean "wish" or "desire" when there is an UNCERTAIN future
 result "I hope it's sunny tomorrow" // That kind of hope is personal optimism and unfulfilled longing
 - b. Hope, Biblically, is settled and joyful confidence in what God has done and will do
 - c. The answer and assurance may not come as quickly as you would like. There may be a long night of sorrowing repentance, pleading, tears
- 7. **Vs. 7-8** O Israel [all of us now!], hope in the LORD; [why wait around? Come see what I've found!] For with the LORD there is mercy, And with Him is abundant redemption. ⁸ And He shall redeem Israel from all his iniquities.
