Lesson 8 - Wednesday: Blessings of Righteous Living

- 1. 5 "books" (collections) of Psalms opens with "Blessed"
 - a. Matthew (linked to OT) records 5 sermons from Jesus (the first sermon Mt. 5-7) begins with "Blessed"
 - b. The last book of the Bible records the same word 7 times "Blessed"
 - c. The first glimpse of "praises" (Tehillim the Hebrew title of the book of Psalms) is the RESULT: "blessed"
 - d. THEN, the cause ...is the man who walks not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor stands in the path of sinners, nor sits in the seat of the scornful; ² but his delight is in the law of the LORD, and in His law he meditates day and night.
- 2. What does it mean to be "blessed"? Blessing in Hebrew (and Greek) come from two different words

Esher - Translated "happy" or "blessed"

- Word for envious desire, to be in a good (enviously desirable) position
- From the Hebrew root osher go straight, advance, make progress (indicating taking steps toward a good goal)
- Carnal prosperity some may call "good fortune" that reflects a "good life"
- It is reserved for man. Not used in connection with God God does not bless us with this word
- BECAUSE there is nothing in man that God enviously desires or aspires to or wishes to have
- Since we have no grounds of aspiring to be God, it is never used from man to God
- Like a "congratulations" in recognition of the natural effect of righteous living.
 - The consequence and condition of life for those who choose obedience to God
 - Psalm 34:8 Oh, taste and see that the Lord is good; <u>blessed</u> is the man who <u>trusts in Him!</u>
 - Psalm 41:1 <u>Blessed</u> is he who <u>considers the poor</u>; the LORD will deliver him in time of trouble.
 - Psalm 84:5 <u>Blessed</u> is the man whose strength is in You, <u>whose heart is set on pilarimage</u>.
 - Psalm 112:1 <u>Blessed</u> is the man who <u>fears the Lord</u>, who <u>delights areatly in His commandments</u>.
 - Psalm 119:1 <u>Blessed</u> are the <u>undefiled in the way</u>, who <u>walk in the law of the Loro!</u>
 - **Psalm 128:1-2** <u>Blessed</u> is every one who <u>fears the Lord</u>, who <u>walks in His ways</u>. When you eat <u>the labor of your hands</u>, you shall be <u>happy</u>, and it shall be well with you.
 - Psalm 146:5 Happy is he who has the God of Jacob for his help, whose hope is in the Lord his God,
 - Psalm 1:1-2 <u>Blessed</u> is the man who walks not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor stands in the path of sinners, nor sits in the seat of the scornful; ² But his delight is in the law of the LORD, and in His law he meditates day and night.

Barak – Also translated "blessed"

- Usually issued from a greater to a lessor (father to son, king to subjects)
- In this sense, humans "bless" God (acknowledging His superior greatness Ps. 18:46, 103:1)
- God is the source, supreme cause
- Often used as a "benediction" a bestowal of favor or gifts
- God's initiative, He may give when it is not deserved
- God makes it happen
 - **Genesis 1:22** And God blessed them, saying, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth."
 - **Genesis 12:3** I will bless those who bless you, and I will curse him who curses you; and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."
- 3. A Lessons from the garden
 - a. NO crop without the sun and the rain I can not make the sun or rain
 - Barak God gives the blessing of sun and rain
 - God gives life, salvation, Scripture, the Holy Spirit, regeneration.
 - b. NO crop without planted seed I must plant the seed
 - Esher Blessed fruit grows as a natural result
 - We ask for God's blessing, but we should expect to participate, by choosing righteousness.
- 4. The Final Blessing of choosing Christ's righteousness
 - a. **Psalm 37:22** For those blessed by Him shall inherit the earth, but those cursed by Him shall be cut off.
 - b. All of the ESHER is just an illustration of God's BARAK
