<u>Daniel Perrin</u> – Lesson 9: Jerusalem Controversies –

Wednesday August 28: Earthly Duties and Heavenly Outcomes

Text: **Mark 12:13-17** – Then they sent to Him some of the Pharisees and the Herodians, to catch Him in *His* words. ¹⁴ When they had come, they said to Him, "Teacher, we know that You are true, and care about no one; for You do not regard the person of men, but teach the way of God in truth. Is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar, or not? ¹⁵ Shall we pay, or shall we not pay?" But He, knowing their hypocrisy, said to them, "Why do you test Me? Bring Me a denarius that I may see *it*." ¹⁶ So they brought *it*. And He said to them, "Whose image and inscription *is* this?" They said to Him, "Caesar's." ¹⁷ And Jesus answered and said to them, "Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." And they marveled at Him.

- 1. Continued opportunity for trapping Jesus, because of what He did at the Temple.
- 2. NOTICE: It is the Pharisees (religious leaders) JOINING WITH the Herodians (Greek Jews who supported a particular political "candidate" because it was expedient). Planning since...
 - a. I.e. they were supporters of Rome
 - b. When religious and political enemies unite, you know there is spiritual danger
- 3. They hope to trap Jesus
 - a. If He answered one way, they could tell Rome that He rebelled against their authority.
 - b. If He answered the other way, they could show the Jews He was a supporter of Rome.
- 4. Jesus asked for a Roman denarius The Tiberius Caesar tribute coin in use at the time
 - a. IMAGE Tiberius Caesar laurel of victory
 - b. INSCRIPTION Tiberius Caesar, <u>Son of the Divine</u> Augustus
 - c. ON THE BACK A false god with another inscription about the Caesar as the authority over worship
- 5. NOTE: Jesus didn't just give a clever, evasive answer
 - a. His opponents wouldn't have been silenced by that
 - b. NOR did He just teach a lesson about civil responsibility and paying taxes
- 6. He ASKED for that pagan idolatrous coin and taught TWO LESSONS
 - a. ONE: "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's"
 - In other words: despite what the coin says, Caesar is NOT God
 - You can pay your taxes to a corrupt government WITHOUT sacrificing your loyalty to God.
 - b. TWO: He pointed out their hypocrisy
 - They were happy to buy and sell with idolatrous coins
 - Happy to hoard idolatrous coins.
 - All while looking pious claiming that they were keeping every letter of God's Law
 - But as long as the idolatrous coins made them wealthy, they were <u>happy to compromise</u>.
 - They wanted Jesus to give permission to HOARD these coins INSTEAD of paying what was due.
 - c. Jesus forced them to acknowledge the idolatrous nature of the coin: a False God
 - It wasn't the love of God that motivated them to resist paying their tax.
 - It was their love of money.

Mark 12:18-27 – Then *some* Sadducees, who say there is no resurrection, came to Him; and they asked Him, saying: ¹⁹ "Teacher, Moses wrote to us that if a man's brother dies, and leaves *his* wife behind, and leaves no children, his brother should take his wife and raise up offspring for his brother. ²⁰ Now there were seven brothers. The first took a wife; and dying, he left no offspring. ²¹ And the second took her, and he died; nor did he leave any offspring. And the third likewise. ²² So the seven had her and left no offspring. Last of all the woman died also. ²³ Therefore, in the resurrection, when they rise, whose wife will she be? For all seven had her as wife." ²⁴ Jesus answered and said to them, "Are you not therefore mistaken, because you do not know the Scriptures nor the power of God? ²⁵ For when they rise from the dead, they neither marry nor are given in marriage, but are like angels in heaven."

²⁶ But concerning the dead, that they rise, have you not read in the book of Moses, in the *burning* bush *passage*, [Literally "in the bush" – there were no chapters or verses] how God spoke to him, saying, 'I *am* the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob'? ²⁷ He is not the God of the dead, but the God of the living. You are therefore greatly mistaken."

- 7. The Sadducees had their own version of a test the UNANSWERABLE QUESTION
 - a. Pharisees believed in an afterlife / Sadducees were essentially materialists (did not believe in Angels or a life after this earthly life)
 - See Acts 23:8 For Sadducees say that there is no resurrection—and no angel or spirit; but the Pharisees confess both.
 - b. The Sadducees are trying to discredit the Bible's teaching on the Resurrection
 - Thus undermining faith in Jesus' power over sin and death
- 8. We sometimes get hung up on Jesus' response about the condition of our relationships in a SINLESS universe
 - a. We can't picture an existence that isn't "just like" here ... only without things WE don't like.
 - b. And our relationships are so sacred to us that we think they belong to US
 - So our natural inclination is to argue with God and His Word
 - We try to describe what Jesus "should have said" / what WE think He meant
- 9. Jesus' words about marriage here offer us several ESSENTIAL INVITATIONS
 - ONE Read Scripture More to establish what you believe NOT on your feelings about what God would do, but upon His Revealed Word — rightly understood
 - TWO Trust God with my WHOLE Family & Life!
 - THREE TRUST Jesus and His plan when I have limited knowledge of the future.
 - FOUR REST in His love for me AND my family.
 - FIVE Love Jesus MORE than anything!
