## 1. What is "glory"?

- a. *Doxsa* glory / *Doxsazo* to glorify
  - Opinion / Judgment / View (Determination of Value)
  - ALSO PART of the definition: Splendor / Brightness / Majesty this is the pinnacle of value
- b. True Glory is based on God's character Jeremiah 9:23-24 Thus says the LORD: "Let <u>not</u> the wise man glory in his wisdom, let <u>not</u> the mighty man glory in his might, <u>nor</u> let the rich man glory in his riches;<sup>24</sup> But let <u>him who glories glory in this</u>, that he understands and knows Me, that I am the LORD, exercising lovingkindness, judgment, and righteousness in the earth.
- c. In the Bible, the word "GLORY" is paired with things like: God's Law on tables of stone / God's Hand / His Right arm / God's Name / Kingdom / Church / His gospel / His power / Jesus' appearing / Jesus' resurrected body
- 2. A brief background of God's Glory in the Older Testament
  - a. **Exodus 24:17** The sight of the glory of the LORD was like a <u>consuming fire</u> on the top of the mountain in the eyes of the children of Israel. UNAPPROACHABLE BY SINFUL HUMANS
  - b. Exodus 40:35 Moses couldn't enter the Tabernacle because of the glory of the Lord
  - c. 2 Chronicles 7:2 the priests couldn't enter the house of the Lord because of the glory of the Lord
  - d. Ezekiel 10:4 the glory of the Lord is BRIGHTNESS
  - e. Isaiah 2:10 the glory of the Lord is MAJESTY
  - f. **Isaiah 42:8** I am the LORD, that is My name; and My glory I will not give to another, nor My praise to carved images.
  - g. **Exodus 33:18-19** And he said, "Please, show me <u>Your glory.</u>" <sup>19</sup> Then He said, "I will make all <u>My</u> <u>goodness</u> pass before you, and I will proclaim the name of the LORD before you. I will be gracious to whom I will be gracious, and I will have compassion on whom I will have compassion."
- 3. Glory in the Gospel of John
  - a. **1:14** And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and <u>we beheld His glory</u>, the <u>glory as of the only</u> <u>begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth</u>.
    - God's Glory is ACTUALLY SEEN BY HUMANS in the incarnation
  - b. **2:11** This beginning of signs Jesus did in Cana of Galilee, and <u>MANIFESTED His glory</u>; and His disciples believed in Him.
    - We see Jesus' glory when His divine power is manifested but Glory is NOT just power
  - c. **8:50** And I do not seek My own glory
    - True Heavenly Glory is NOT self-seeking in any way / No Selfishness at all
  - d. **17:22** And the <u>alory which You gave Me I HAVE GIVEN THEM</u>, that they may be one just as We are one:
    - Intertwining with the human story plot Glory FOR US
  - e. **17:4-5** I have glorified You on the earth. I have finished the work which You have given Me to do. <sup>5</sup> And now, O Father, <u>glorify Me</u> together with Yourself, with <u>the glory which I had with You before the world</u> <u>was.</u>
    - United glory WITH THE FATHER Before Creation
      - $\circ$  But now, He is ASKING to BE Glorified Something MORE to God' glory than Rulership
      - What MORE is there to Glory than perfection?
  - 4. John shows us God's True Glory in Jesus:

- a. 17:1-2 Jesus spoke these words, lifted up His eyes to heaven, and said: "Father, <u>the hour has come.</u> <u>Glorify Your Son, that Your Son also may glorify You</u>, <sup>2</sup> as You have given Him authority over all flesh, that He should give eternal life to as many as You have given Him.
  - He will be glorified AT AN HOUR a particular time, A specific event.
    - $\circ$   $\,$  Jesus has been looking forward to and talking about this HOUR for His whole ministry.
- b. John 2:4 Jesus tells HIS MOTHER: "My hour has not yet come."
- c. 7:30 & 8:20 No one could lay hands on Jesus because ... His hour had not yet come.
- d. <u>12:23-24</u> Jesus Says: "<u>The hour has come that the Son of Man should be glorified.</u> THEN Jesus explains by describing Himself as a GRAIN OF WHEAT that dies.
- e. **12:27-28** "Now <u>My soul is troubled, and what shall I say? 'Father, save Me from this hour'?</u> But <u>for</u> <u>this purpose I came to this hour.</u><sup>28</sup> Father, <u>glorify Your name.</u>" [Glorified in His ministry — SEE 11:4]
- f. <u>13:1</u> Now before the Feast of the Passover, when <u>Jesus knew that His hour had come</u> that He should depart from this world....
  - This is the PROPHETIC HOUR from Daniel 9 when the Messiah would be "cut off."
  - The Hour that Glorifies the Son is taking our sins on Himself to die in our place.
- g. <u>WHY couldn't He just show us His HEAVENLY glory? How is Dying His Glory?</u>
  - 1. In order to show His glory TO Humanity, He had to show His glory THROUGH Humanity
    - Otherwise, His glory would be the consuming fire that no sinner could approach
  - If I am a good parent, do all good things that a parent does, but I do NOT risk my life for my child when the child is endangered ... I am NOT a good parent (even if I have been nice, trained them well, fed and clothed them)
    - Pinnacle of parenthood: risking life for a child.
    - The GLORY of the parent is seen when there is OPPORTUNITY to sacrifice
    - SO, God's Glory is NOT glory UNLESS Jesus comes down to Earth to rescue sinners
