<u>Daniel Perrin</u> – L3: Images From Marriage – Thursday, April 17: The Harlot is Judged

- 1. Revelation 19:1–9 Describes Two long-anticipated Conclusions simultaneously
 - a. Good to see them back to back / Literally right before you: THIS ... or THIS
 - b. A visualized illustration of the contrast Paul articulated in **Romans 6:23** placed in the context of Bible prophecy "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."
- 2. Revelation 18 (fall of Babylon united religious/political forces against God) moves right into Revelation 19 & 20, apparently in chronological order
 - a. In <u>close connection</u> with the Second Coming, but it is NOT the Second Coming Yet
 - b. Revelation 19:1-9 is a Heavenly scene of cheering that the two outcomes are set and will be carried out soon. First John overhears it, then he witnesses it taking place in the following verses

HERE'S THE TEXT: Revelation 19:1–9 – <u>After these things</u> I heard a <u>loud voice</u> of a <u>great multitude in heaven</u>, saying, "Alleluia! Salvation and glory and honor and power belong to the Lord our God! ² For true and righteous are His judgments, because He has judged the great harlot who corrupted the earth with her fornication; and He has avenged on her the blood of His servants shed by her." ³ <u>Again they said</u>, "Alleluia! Her smoke rises up forever and ever!" ⁴ And the twenty-four elders and the four living creatures fell down and worshiped God who sat on the throne, saying, "Amen! Alleluia!" ⁵ Then a voice came from the throne, saying, "Praise our God, all you His servants and those who fear Him, both small and great!"

- It's as if all of Heaven is holding its breath waiting to break out in cheering at the right time
 - Two results stand out in the prophecies of Daniel and Revelation: Judgment AGAINST the beast powers
 - Judgment FOR the Saints

⁶ <u>And I heard</u>, as it were, the voice of a great multitude, as the sound of many waters and as the sound of mighty thunderings, saying, "Alleluia! For the Lord God Omnipotent reigns! ⁷ Let us be glad and rejoice and give Him glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and <u>His wife has made herself ready.</u>" ⁸ And to her it was granted to be arrayed in fine linen, clean and bright, for the fine linen is the <u>righteous</u> acts of the saints.

- [KJV READS more accurately to the Greek text, "the righteousness of saints."
 - Why is this important? The saints have no righteousness. NOT of their own. Their righteousness is really Christ's.
 - It is NOT the saints ACTS that give them righteousness. The acts of the saints are a visible demonstration that they have accepted Christ's righteousness AS THEIR OWN.]

3. LOOK FOR THE Big Ideas IN THE TEXT

- a. Big Idea #1 Heaven is interested
 - All Heaven CHEERS 3x "Alleluia in the first paragraph (vss. 1–5), once in the second paragraph
 - They CHEER to see God's people united with Him
 - o BECAUSE that gives an EVEN CLEARER picture of God's character
 - Angels want YOU to have a close relationship with God.
 - THEIR longing is for YOU to be in an intimate relationship with God.
 - They CHEER for the marriage supper of the Lamb.
 - Cheering because someone put a ball in a hole (that's what every ball game is)
 - o Is NOTHING compared with the cheering of Angels for a victory that actually matters!
 - This victory celebration will be nothing like spraying champagne around a locker room.

⁹ <u>Then he said to me, "Write:</u> 'Blessed are those who are <u>called to the marriage supper of the Lamb!</u>'" And he said to me, "These are the true sayings of God."

- But I'm not here to preach about sports teams just dropping a bit of encouragement for those who will listen.
- It is the conclusion of what they have been working for
- No jealousy to see humanity elevated to a position of honor
 - NOT by their goodness

b. Big Idea #2 - Built on the metaphor of marriage

- Marriage designed by God to tell a story
- All the Bible images of husband and wife are brought to bear on this scene
 - Exclusivity / Intimacy / Faithfulness / Trust / Devotion / Unity / Working together / Tenderness /
 Dependability / Encouragement
 - THIS IS WHAT GOD WANTS AND what WE need!
- We have made weddings and marriages more worldly than they should be
 - Nonetheless, a wedding is well-suited to symbolize the conclusion God wants in His relationship with each of us
 - o Major event / not just a handshake or a high five to a winning teammate
 - o Full of emotion
 - Lasting / exclusive
 - Solemn / Full of responsibility ... AND Consequence!
 - Your life and future changes based on WHO you choose to marry
 - o ... and HOW you conduct yourself in that marriage
 - All of this tells us something about the marriage imagery in Revelation 19

c. Big Idea #3 - First Scene (vss. 1-5) - Christ suffers as the rejected husband

- The woman He committed HIMSELF to was unfaithful (represented as becoming an unfaithful harlot)
- In Revelation 19, the relationship is officially <u>declared</u> to be OVER.
 - It had ended long before but at this point, every official signature is signed.
 - While there is cheering for the rescue of the Saints, the marriage imagery reveals that Jesus still experiences the pain of rejection by those He loved.

d. Big Idea #4 - Second Scene - Christ Receives His kingdom

• Embodied as the New Jerusalem — God's people adorned with the Righteousness of Christ revealed in Scripture

e. Big Idea #5 - Until sin is gone, there will be TWO GROUPS

- One Group of intimacy that marriage is an apt example of
- The other group is of the exact opposite
 - Harlotry / unfaithfulness / selfishness

f. Big Idea #6- Every decision matters

- Every marriage story has an outcome there are only two and they are based on our decisions
- The two GROUPS depicted in Revelation 19 illustrate the decisions of individuals.
- The Bride MADE HERSELF READY That's a culmination of decisions that have an outcome
