#### TUESDAY Pesach

Pesach: English "Pay-saak" Hebrew "pay-saa" = PASS/OVER

- Festival of Blood / Redemption / Deliverance from slavery
- Laid foundation message for Gospel of Jesus Christ
- Original Exodus narrative points forward / connects to
  - o gospel of Jesus highlighting everlasting gospel of RBF
  - His substitutionary death = Theme of His atoning blood and redemption runs thru Scripture – from Genesis to Revelation
- Exodus 12:17–23 Point-by-Point Summary of symbols of Pesach
   Unleavened bread / Blood of spotless Lamb / Hyssop / Passover Night
   Exodus 12:17 = Command to observe FEAST OF UNLEAVENED BREAD =
   commemorates turning point from bondage

Ex 12:18 = Action Required: Eat unleavened bread for 7 days straight
Ex 12:19 -20 = Action Required: remove all leaven from all homes anyone (native-born Israelites / foreigners) who eats leaven cut off
(excluded) from Israel's covenant community. All held to same standard

# **Exodus 12:21 - Sacrifice of the Passover Lamb**

- Action Required: Moses instructs elders to:
  - Select = SPOTLESS lamb for each household
  - Kill = Passover lamb in preparation for night of deliverance
- This act initiates = central ritual of Passover

Exodus 12:22 – Action Required: apply blood of Lamb/

- Use bunch of hyssop to dip in lamb's blood
- Strike lintel (top) and two doorposts of each home w/ blood.

**Instruction:** No one is to **leave the house until morning**—staying inside under covering of the blood ensures protection.

Ex 12:23 – Divine Protection by the Blood =

God's Action: LORD will pass thru Egypt to strike down = firstborn God's Protection — when Lord sees blood on doorway

- He will pass over that house
- He not permit destroyer to enter / harm those inside
- Blood serves as = visible sign of faith /obedience

shielding them from judgment

Role of Blood in Passover (Exodus 12:17–23)

- **Blood of spotless lamb** = must be placed on doorposts of every Israelite home = marked their homes for divine protection
- **Blood** = became visible sign of faith / obedience
- In this act = Israelites weren't saved by nationality or moral superiority—but by grace thru faith / expressed in obedience
- Blood of lamb = protection / redemption/ salvation thru faith
- Symbolized life = at a time of death
- Death passed over those covered by blood
- Foreshadowed = spotless Lamb of God / Cross
  - Lamb's blood didn't just point to escape from Egypt
  - pointed ahead to Jesus' blood shed for = salvation of world
  - His merits /Righteousness By FAITH /to all covered by His blood
- John 1:29 "Behold! Lamb of God who takes away/ sin of the world!"
- 1 Corinthians 5:7 "Christ, our Passover, was sacrificed for us."

  Just as Israelites= spared thru lamb's blood/ we're saved = Christ's blood
- Passover lamb had to be without blemish (Exod. 12:5)
  - powerful type of Jesus Christ
- **1 Peter 1:18–19** you were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver or gold... <sup>19</sup>but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot.

## **Significance of Unleavened Bread**

- Symbolic Meaning: Complete separation from sin
  - lin Scripture = leaven often symbolizes sin / corruption
  - o 1 Corinthians 5:6–7 "Do you not know that a little leaven leavens the whole lump? Therefore purge out the old leaven..."
- Jesus = true Passover Lamb = sinless and undefiled
  - o "unleavened bread" of heaven I am the bread of Life

Hebrews 4:15 "He was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin."

# Hyssop Branch = Symbol of God's purifying GRACE

- A Bunch of hyssop = to apply blood to doorframes (Exod. 12:22).
- Biblical imagery, hyssop represents cleansing / spiritual renewal Psalm 51:7 "Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow."
- Even this small detail foreshadows how Christ's blood purifies us from all sin.

# **God's Plan of Salvation by Grace = consistent from Exodus to Cross**

- Original Passover = marked freedom from slavery in Egypt
  - "When I see the blood, I will pass over you." Exo 12:13
- Passover Night = Judgment passed over those covered by grace
- Greater Passover in Jesus = marks freedom from slavery to sin
  - beginning of our journey to = heavenly Promised Land
- Blood on doorpost represented blood of sinless Substitute **Ephesians 1:7** "In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins..."

#### What Blood of Jesus = Teaches Us About Sin

- Wasn't enough to send an angel / or a prophet
- God Himself came down / bled = our sacrificial Substitute
- Heb 9:22 "Without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness."
- Sin is not just a mistake—cosmic rupture /required divine sacrifice
- The cross proves both = horror of sin / depth of God's love
- Romans 5:8 "God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

# **Are You Covered by = sacrificial Blood of Christ?**

- Just as Israelites had to apply the blood
  - We too must receive Christ's sacrifice personally.
- Not saved by good intentions / knowledge / heritage /
  - But by being covered by = blood of the Lamb

**Revelation 1:5** "To Him who loved us and washed us from our sins in His own blood."

- Are you under the blood? Have you received His deliverance?
- Passover is more than an event— portrait of the gospel.
- Reminds us = God delivers / purifies /redeems by **blood of Lamb**
- Just as Israelites began their journey to freedom that night, we begin our spiritual journey by **faith in Jesus** = our Passover Lamb
- Blood of Lamb: Symbolizes atonement/ faith / divine protection

Heb 3:15 "Today, if you hear His voice, do not harden your hearts."

• Staying Inside: Indicates trust in God's provision / protection thru sacrificial blood / as we remain "in Christ"
