## Lesson 2 Surprised by Grace

- This week/ study 2 of most fascinating stories = In book of Joshua
  - discover relevance to our faith today
- Second generation = Israel = standing at edge of Promised Land
  - o at border of Canaan = for / second time
- One would think = God's promise of giving land to Israelites
  - o did not require any effort from them = YET
- Assurance of divine support= <u>does not override</u> human responsibility
- Expectations run high = but last time Israel was at border
  - and had same task = resulted in an abysmal failure
- Still = God's grace = infinite possibilities to surprise us

Memory Text: **Hebrews 11:31** "By faith the harlot Rahab did not perish with those who did not believe, when she had received the spies with peace"

- We've all sighed, "Why did I do this again?"— haven't we?
- History repeats itself—and so do we
- Humanity has pattern = stumbling/ falling/ faltering
- But, in "covenant relationship w/ Christ" = our story doesn't end w/failure = always leans toward redemption

## Sunday Second Chance

- Israel stood again at threshold of Promised Land = edge of promise
- Bitter memory of first disastrous encounter = Numbers 13-14
  - Spies sent to Canaan returned w/fear rebellion followed
- 40 years lost because of unbelief = 40 years of wandering
- Would this be different? Joshua determined not to repeat
- **Joshua 2:1** sent two spies from Acacia Grove [Hebrew shi-TEEM] to assess situation: defenses / morale of inhabitants / lay of the land
- God's promises were sure = but human cooperation still mattered

- Faith did not eliminate responsibility
- Trusting God meant doing their part w/prayerful diligence
- Spies went—God surprised them w/grace--found refuge in house of harlot = Rahab / whose past was a tangle of brokenness
  - By worldly standards = an unlikely candidate for grace
  - Yet Heaven saw in her = heart open to faith
  - James / Johnny will cover her story
- Hebrews 11:31 calls her by name among faithful = Amazing grace
- Place where spies were sent from—Shittim[shi-TEEM]
  - brought its own heavy memories
- Numbers 25 It was there / Israel once fell into idolatry/immorality = seduced by Moabite women at Balaam's cunning instigation
- At Shittim / grievously broke covenant w/God = again become place of defeat?
- Tension was real = would Israel / poised once more to enter land, repeat sins of the past? Or would grace write a new story?
- We face same tension today = How often do we, standing at the edge of new beginnings = feel haunting pull of past failures?
- How tempting to believe = forever defined by our worst moments
- Yet grace—surprising, relentless grace—says otherwise
- In Christ, every Shittimcan become = stepping stone to Canaan
  - Every failure can be turned = into a testimony
- Consider Peter = brash / passionate / devoted
  - Yet = in moment of crisis = became a denier of Christ
  - Three times = he disowned the One he loved most
- John 21:15–17 After His resurrection = Jesus met Peter w/question, not an accusation: "Do you love Me?"
- 3 times Peter denied--3 times Jesus invited him to reaffirm his love
- Grace not only forgave Peter—it reinstated him to ministry

- Israel's second chance / Rahab's redemption / Peter's restoration—
  each paints same breathtaking picture: God is a God of NEW
  BEGINNINGS = second chances—and third, and fourth, and
  beyond.
- **Ephesians 2:8** "By grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God"
- Grace / not earned / not deserved
  - Grace = is given because of who God is / not who we are
  - Grace = power of a New Beginning
- Rahab's life reminds us = no one is beyond / reach of grace
- Israel's second march toward Canaan reminds us = nations—even spiritual communities—can be given new opportunities
- Peter's restoration reminds us = personal failures do not have the final word over our lives
- Beauty of grace = not only pardons / but empowers
- Rahab did not remain Rahab the harlot
  - she became = part of Christ's lineage (Matthew 1:5).
- Peter did not remain fearful denier
  - he became = bold preacher at Pentecost
- Israel, thru faith/obedience = would finally inherit Promised Land
- Grace and Responsibility = tempting to think because grace = gift
  - We have no role to play
- Book of Joshua reminds us
  - Divine assurance = doesn't eliminate = human effort
- God promised Israel the land=but they still had to march/ fight/trust
- Likewise, God promises us victory over sin—but we must walk forward in obedience, empowered by His Spirit.
- **2 Peter 3:18** grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

- If God has given us MULTIPLE **SECOND CHANCES** 
  - o what about those around us?
- Are we willing to extend same mercy to others that God has so freely given to us?
- To be recipients of grace = is to be agents of grace
  - o extend invitation of new beginnings to
  - o the broken / wounded / even to those who have hurt us

## **Conclusion: Surprised by Grace**

- As we have looked at
  - Israel = poised once more at edge of promise
  - Rahab = opening her heart to new future
  - Peter = rise from ashes of denial
- REMEMBER: Grace still surprises restores / calls us forward
  - No matter how many times we have failed
  - o No matter how heavy / past weighs on our shoulders
  - God's grace is bigger
- Right now = God's grace invites you to believe again
  - to hope again = to step forward again
- Will you trust the God of second chances?
