The Enemy Within

ABSG quote: Joshua 7 is the first instance where, thru a tragic experience = people of Israel learned the far-reaching consequences of the covenant & its deep meaning. While obedience to the stipulations of the covenant secured victory, disregarding the terms of the covenant brought defeat.

Warning to us today = to walk in covenant relationship w/Lord

Memory verse frames = entire lesson: Jeremiah 17:10, ESV

"I the LORD search the heart and test the mind, to give every
man according to his ways, according to the fruit of his deeds"

- In conquest of Canaan = Israel's journey = more than military campaign = was **spiritual journey**= God testing = hearts / minds
- Victory depended not on military strength
- but on faithfulness to God's covenant = God was more....
 concerned w/character/obedience than outward achievements

Joshua 7 = Israel learned = painful lesson /defeat/ at Ai

- o [spelled AI = pronounced EYE]
- Most dangerous enemy = **not fortified Canaanite cities**,
 - Not advanced technology of their enemies
 - But unfaithfulness = within their own camp
- Similarly today = as we stand / border of Promised Land
 - Our faithfulness / tested while waiting
 - heavenly inheritance
- 1 Peter 1:4 Our inheritance is "incorruptible and undefiled ...reserved in heaven."
- Our greatest battles often internal = pride / covetousness
 - o self-confidence

Sunday Breach of the Covenant

- Joshua 7 = What went wrong 1st attempt to conquer Ai
- Two major causes led to Israel's defeat
 - Achan's hidden sin deliberate disobedience
 - Israel's overconfidence relying on their own judgment without consulting God
- **Joshua 7:1** ¹But the children of Israel committed a trespass regarding the accursed things, for Achan ... of the tribe of Judah, took of the accursed things; so the anger of the LORD burned against the children of Israel.
- Joshua 7:11 = God exposes / gravity of Achan's sin
 - o using 6 distinct Hebrew words for sin
 - highlighted by repeated use Hebrew gam = even/also
- Joshua 7:11-12 ¹¹ Israel has sinned [#1 khata' = basic wrongdoing] and they have also transgressed [#2 'abar = crossing forbidden boundaries] My covenant which I commanded them. For they have even taken [#3 aqakh = seizing what belonged to God] some of the accursed things, and have both stole [#4 ganab = violating divine ownership] and deceived [#5 kakhash = covering up the crime] and they have also put it among their own stuff [#6 Hidden sim—placing stolen goods among personal belongings—sins multiply when they're hidden. ¹² Therefore / children of Israel could not stand before their enemies, but turned their backs before their enemies, because they have become doomed to destruction
- Covenant between Yahweh/Israel involved people at both
 - Individual / corporate levels = shared responsibility
- Reveals = key covenant principle:
 - **Obedience brings blessing** (Deuteronomy 28:1–2).

- Disobedience brings defeat (Deuteronomy 28:15).
- Sin of one person (Achan) = brought guilt on entire nation
- Sin doesn't happen = in vacuum
- Our actions impact not only ourselves
 - o but touches/harms whole community we represent
- 1 Cor 12:26 "If one member suffers, all suffer together."
- Scandals in churches = lead to public distrust in Christianity
- Corporate fraud = damages an entire company's reputation
- Small hidden sins = lead to greater disasters when unconfessed
- True repentance = must precede restoration
- Achan had ample opportunity = (1) when he saw armies of Israel return from Ai defeated/disheartened; (2) saw Joshua and elders of Israel bowed to earth in grief; (3) when he heard proclamation to the camp = great crime committed; (4) During the solemn investigation = saw his tribe pointed out/ then his family = Still no penitence = kept his lips sealed = hiding his sin
- Until God pointed out his household = him directly
 - Confessed only after exposure not from godly sorrow
 - But worldly regret = too little / too late
 - God desires confession that comes from desire to turn away from sin = not just fear of consequences
- Judas (Matt 27:3–5) worldly regret/ not true repentance
- David (Ps 51) genuine "Create in me a clean heart, O God."
- Israel's restoration came only after:
 - o Identifying and removing sin from their midst
 - Renewing their covenant w/God
 - Victory in surrender = yielding to leading of Lord
- Our personal victory likewise depends on:

- Daily heart searching = **Psalm 139:23–24**: "Search me, O God, and know my heart...and lead me in the way everlasting."
- Trusting Christ for cleansing / victory 1 John 1:9:
 "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

CLOSING THOUGHT:

- Covenant breach at Ai reminds us:
 - Victory is not by strength = but by faithfulness
- God's searching gaze sees beyond appearances
 - o to/heart
- Hidden sin brings defeat
 - true repentance restores us to God's favor
- Today, God calls His people to renewed loyalty
 - o as we stand on the borders of eternity
- May we yield fully to Him that our lives, both individually and corporately, may reflect the purity of Christ.
- **Joshua 24:15**: "Choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve... But as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord."
